

Communicate Effectively to Inform and Educate

ACTIVITIES

- Developed silicosis webpage on the DPH website
- Developed trainings, materials, and talking points
- Established and manage silicosis contract for worker outreach and engagement
- Convene PH programs & SME for knowledge sharing
- Delivered trainings to County partners
- Visited 218 registered stone fabrication businesses
- LAHAN alert sent out with information to clinicians

- Lack of awareness among health care providers
- No existing strategy for consumer messaging: product safe for consumers, dangerous for workers



Strengthen, Support, Mobilize Communities & Partnerships

ACTIVITIES

- Expanding worker outreach beyond SF valley
- Collaborating with Cal/OSHA Bilingual Education Unit on outreach
- Partnering with CBOs for worker outreach & community engagement
- Supporting CASS study through CDPH/UCLA (study of stone cutting workers) and qualitative worker study
- Convening all agencies/teams working on silicosis prevention

- Recommended that DMH develop mental health materials and resources for silicosis patients and their families at Olive View Hospital
- Coordination and involvement of high-level stakeholders (DEO)
- No coordinated/organized body of stone fabrication workers (no union)
- Educating and motivating employers to implement safety measures and comply with regulations




Create, Champion, and Implement Policies, Plans, & Laws

ACTIVITIES

- Met with elected officials' offices to raise awareness
- Supported efforts to pass the new Cal/OSHA Silica ETS (2023)
- Supporting DEO to identify a range of stakeholders per board motion
- Participating in silicosis convening in May at UCLA

- No identified county-wide strategy to reduce worker exposure to RCS
- Unintended consequences of new ETS on smaller businesses
- Manufacturers and industry support of new ETS but could force smaller shops and owner-operators out of business



Assurance: Enable Equitable Access; Build a Diverse & Skilled Workforce; Improve & Innovate Through Evaluation, Research, and Quality Improvement; Build and Maintain a Strong Organizational Infrastructure for Public Health

ACTIVITIES

- Developing & providing educational materials and trainings (Sp/Eng)
- Explore hosting first worker training on engineering controls, and provide PAPR to conduct pilot study to assess if providing free/lowcost PPE improves workers' frequency and use of PAPR
- Developing an approach to prioritizing outreach for smaller and unlicensed businesses
- Training DPH workforce and other county departments, as requested
- Consult external partners to improve issue & industry knowledge

- Educating clinicians on silicosis symptoms
- Educate employers about responsibility to conduct training & screenings
- Shortage of Industrial Hygienists and Occupational Health
- Lack of centralized coordination
